The purpose of The American Legion Memorial Home Corporation (ALMHC) of Springfield, an Illinois Not-for-Profit corporation, and an IRS Section 501 (c)(2) entity, is to hold title to property, collect income therefrom, pay expenses such as property taxes, utilities, etc. and to return the entire amount collected, less expenses, at the end of the fiscal year to the Springfield Post No.32, American Legion, Department of Illinois, an Illinois Not-for-Profit corporation, and an IRS Section 501 (c) (19) entity. The property that the ALMHC controls are 1120 Sangamon Avenue; 1125 Joles Avenue; 1117 Joles Avenue; 1132 Sangamon Avenue which is presently being sold contract for deed to the Sangamon County Republican Central Committee; Burial plots at Oak Ridge Cemetery, Calvary Cemetery and Roselawn Cemeterv.

The members of the (ALMHC), also serve on the Club Committee. These members are comprised of the American Legion Springfield Post 32 elected officers: the Commander, the Senior Vice Commander, the Junior Vice Commander, the Finance Officer, the most-recent Past Commander and three (3) members elected from the Post 32 membership. The three members of the Club Committee/ALMHC shall be elected at the regular Post election, two (2) members shall be nominated and elected in even numbered years for a term of two (2) years, and one (1) member shall be nominated and elected in odd-numbered years for a term of two (2) years.

All Club Committee members must be in "good standing" with the Post, and they are responsible for the management, control, operations and preservation of the Post bar, Mess Hall Restaurant facilities and offices. This includes all the employees that are employed by the (Post) Club Committee. Both the Club Committee and ALMHC meet monthly, normally on the third

Tuesday of each month, beginning at 5:00 PM. Annually, the Club Committee members elect a chairperson and a secretary at the Club Committee's first regular meeting. The ALMHC elects a President and a secretary at the first regular meeting. These members of the ALMHC and Club Committee are volunteers who spend a lot of their time keeping your Post bar and Mess Hall Restaurant open and operating for you.

As you are aware our Post and Mess Hall Restaurant are open to the public. We strongly encourage all Post 32, Unit 32, and Squadron 32 members, along with their family and friends, to patronize **YOUR** Post bar and Mess Hall Restaurant. It is becoming increasingly more difficult to keep these Post entities operating due to utility costs; supply costs; licensing; employee costs. Think about it, the next time you journey out for an outstanding meal, maybe an adult beverage and you want to try your luck at the video gaming, **patronize YOUR POST #32 and MESS HALL RESTAURANT. WE NEED YOU!** 

**Post Finances:** In September of each year the Post membership votes on the Annual Budget, as our budget year is from October 1 of each year to September 30 of the next year. As always, ANY member of Springfield Post 32 may review the financial statements, as everything is open and available to MEMBERS.

The 91st Annual Lincoln Pilgrimage was a smashing success, despite some less than stellar winter weather. Of the 17 American Legion Departments invited, 10 sent delegations: Arkansas, Connecticut, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Oklahoma, Michigan, Missouri, Nebraska, Washington and Wisconsin.

Other National Officers attending included Roger Mathison, National Vice Commander the American Legion; Butch Ray, National Vice Commander the Sons of the American Legion; and Candidate for National President Pam Ray.

Mayor Buscher attended, placed a wreath, and spoke at the Tomb. She also gave words of welcome during Breakfast and the Lincoln Commemoration Luncheon. Other dignitaries took part in the Tomb Ceremony: Illinois State Senators Doris Turner and Steve McClure; Illinois State Rep. Mike Coffey; and Illinois National Guard Asst. Adjutant, Brigadier General Lenny Williams representing the President of the United States.

There were 198 breakfast tickets sold, and 174 tickets sold for the Abraham Lincoln commemorative luncheon. The block of rooms at the President Abraham Lincoln Hotel was full. The impact of the Pilgrimage on Springfield's economy is impressive. Revenues from the Breakfast equals \$5,940.00; and revenues from The Lunch equals \$6,090.00 – a total of \$11,580 added to the Springfield economy. We also had a great crowd at the Post 32 open house. Thanks to all the volunteers who assisted with The Pilgrimage. This event is very special to the Post 32 family. We could not do it without all of you.

Lastly, If anyone served or knows someone who has served at the below locations during the dates specified, I would like to reach out to them too.

September 15, 1964 - November 25, 1964 - Naval Recruit Training Center, San Diego.

November 18, 1964 - July 20, 1967, Assigned to USS Canberra (Destroyer).

November 16, 1967 - February 16, 1968, Assigned to USS Piedmont.

Anyone having information or assisting in reviewing the military records will remain confidential.

## **Keeping Our Promise to the Nation's Veterans**

Last week, I testified before a joint session of the Senate and House Veterans' Affairs Committees. While this is usually a forum for The American Legion to present legislative priorities, most questions from members of Congress were related to recent policy and personnel actions by the White House and U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), including firings, contract cancellations, hiring freezes, return to work orders and voluntary resignations.

Billed as an effort to increase government efficiency, there has been growing concern in the veteran community these actions have had, and will continue to have, significant negative impacts on VA's core missions. I understand these concerns and empathize with veterans who are anxious about the speed and justification for these changes. On Tuesday, a leaked internal memo outlined a process by which VA will conduct a department-wide personnel review by May 9 and publish a plan for Reduction-in-Force by the end of Fiscal Year 2025, "as required by [the Office of Management & Budget and the Office of Personnel Management]." This agency review could potentially lead to a further 83,000 job cuts, reducing the total VA staff to 2019 levels.

While The American Legion believes VA should be efficient and accountable for the veterans it serves, a 2019 staff posture does not take into consideration the increased demand for health care and benefits after passage of the PACT Act in 2022. With fewer employees, the VA's ability to meet this demand would be called into question, and considering roughly 25% of federal employees are veterans themselves, up to

83,000 job cuts could put up to 20,000+ veterans out of work.

In Washington, D.C., The American Legion is consistently engaged on your behalf. As these cuts have the potential to threaten services our nation's veterans earned and depend on, I promise our 1.6 million members — and all veterans — we are taking action. The American Legion will work to ensure the administration's efforts to make VA more efficient do not result in unintended consequences for veterans. I ask all Legionnaires to be active in your peer support networks and Be the One to assist your fellow veterans and their families in need.

During our 2025 Washington Conference, we met with VA Secretary Doug Collins and senior personnel at VA's internal agencies to communicate our priorities and concerns and ask for increased transparency related to the methodology and potential impacts of agency actions. We are committed to working with VA leadership to ensure your voice is heard. Furthermore, we are actively communicating with members of Congress and will immediately raise the alarm when we see any mission-critical impact to veterans.

That's where you come in. Our voice in D.C. is only powerful if we hear from Legionnaires and communicate your message to policymakers. So if you or an immediate family member are personally impacted by recent or future government actions, I ask you to contact our Government Relations office and tell your story via The American Legion Impact Survey:
